Title V Women's Health-Related Priority Needs:

- ▶ Promote healthy nutrition and physical activity among MCAH populations throughout the lifespan beginning with exclusive breastfeeding of infants to six months of age.
- ▶ Link the MCAH population to needed medical, mental, social, dental, and community services to promote equity in access to quality services.
- ▶ Improve maternal health by optimizing the health and well-being of girls and women across the life course.
- ▶ Reduce maternal morbidity and mortality and the increasing disparity in maternal health outcomes.

State Performance and Outcome Measures Associated with Women's Health-Related Priority Needs

State Performance Measure 4: Percent of women with a recent live birth who reported binge drinking during the 3 months prior to pregnancy.

Data Source: Maternal and Infant Health Assessment (CA DPH)

Measure Definition: Percent of women with a recent live birth reporting they had 4 or more drinks in one sitting at least once during the 3 months before they got pregnant with their most recent live-born infant.

State Performance Measure 6: Percent of women of reproductive age who are obese.

Data Source: BRFSS

Measure Definition: Obesity is defined as a body mass index (BMI) equal to or greater than 30; BMI is calculated from self-reported weight and height by dividing the weight in kilograms by height in meters squared (kg/m²).

State Performance Measure 7: Percent of women whose live birth occurred less than 24 months after a prior birth.

Data Source: California Birth Statistical Master file

Measure Definition: Percent of women whose live birth occurred less than 24 months after a prior birth.
