Title V Women's Health-Related Priority Needs:

- ▶ Family violence, including intimate partner violence and child abuse.
- ▶ Drug and alcohol abuse, including accessibility of services (and prevention of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome).
- ▶ Mental health, including accessibility of services.

State Performance and Outcome Measures Associated with Women's Health-Related Priority Needs

State Performance Measure 1: Improve Oregon's systems and services for screening women for domestic and sexual violence (DSV) and for linking those affected by DSV to adequate services.

Data Source: Oregon's local Family Planning Clinic staff collect and input clinic visit record data into the regional Ahlers database

Measure Definition: Percent of family planning clinic encounters in which relationship safety was discussed with the client.

State Performance Measure 3: Percent of all Medicaid clients with an expected delivery date during the calendar year who were screened for depression during the time period from 9 months before delivery to 1 year after delivery.

Data Source: State Medicaid claims data

Measure Definition: Percent of all Medicaid clients with an expected delivery date during the calendar year who were screened for depression during the time period from 9 months before delivery to 1 year after delivery.

Additional Data Associated with Women's Health-Related Priority Needs

This section lists other data sources that Title V agencies included in their 2010 Needs Assessments regarding the status of women's health outside of pregnancy.

Percent of women reporting that they did not have any form of health care coverage.

Data Source: BRFSS

Percent of mothers of 2-year-olds who had at least one occasion of binge drinking in the past 12 months.

Data Source: PRAMS

Percent of mothers of 2-year-olds who reported that a health care worker talked with them about how drinking alcohol can affect them.

Data Source: PRAMS

Percent of women who drank any alcohol in the 3 months before pregnancy.

Data Source: PRAMS

Percent of women reporting that someone had sex with them against their will or without their consent at some time during their life.

Data Source: BRFSS

Percent of women reporting that they were injured as a result of being hit, slapped, punched, shoved, kicked, or otherwise physically hurt by an intimate partner.

Data Source: BRFSS

Percent of mothers of 2-year-olds who reported that an intimate partner pushed, hit, slapped, kicked, choked or physically hurt them in the past 12 months.

Data Source: PRAMS

Percent of mothers of 2-year-olds who reported that they received help with a family violence problem in the past 12 months.

Data Source: PRAMS

Percent of women reporting that their mental health was not good for 15 or more of the past 30 days.

Data Source: BRFSS

Percent of women reporting symptoms consistent with a major depressive episode.

Data Source: BRFSS

Percent of mothers of 2-year-olds reporting that during the 12 months after their child's birth they had a period of 2 or more weeks when almost every day they felt sad or depressed for most of the day.

Data Source: PRAMS
