





HRSA'S FEDERAL HOME VISITING PROGRAM:

Partnering with Parents to Help Children Succeed

In FY 2015 the Federal Home Visiting Program served approximately **145,500** parents and children in all **50** states, the District of Columbia, and **5** territories.

The number of children and parents served has quadrupled since FY 2012.

Home visits have increased five-fold, with more than 2.3 million provided over the past four years.



The Federal Home Visiting Program serves many of the most vulnerable families. In FY 2015:

INCOME



77%

of participating families had household incomes at or below **100 percent** of the Federal Poverty guidelines (\$24,250 for a family four)



46%

of participating families were at or below **50 percent** of these guidelines

EDUCATION



31%

of adult program participants had less than a high school education



35%

had a high school diploma

Families served by the Federal Home Visiting Program were at risk for poor family and child outcomes:



22%

of newly enrolled households included pregnant teens



12%

of newly enrolled households reported substance abuse



15%

of newly enrolled households reported a history of child abuse and maltreatment

The Federal Home Visiting Program is reaching more communities. In FY 2015:
