

HRSA's Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program

- Supports the [Michigan Home Visiting Program](#) and provides voluntary, evidence-based home visiting programs for at-risk pregnant women and families with children through kindergarten entry
- Builds upon decades of scientific research showing that home visits by a nurse, social worker, early childhood educator, or other trained professional during pregnancy and in the first years of a child's life helps prevent child abuse and neglect, supports positive parenting, improves maternal and child health, and promotes child development and school readiness

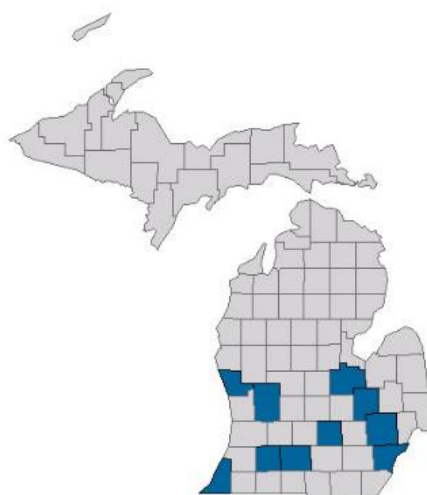
Michigan MIECHV Program At-a-Glance

Michigan Serves a High-Risk Population

MIECHV Program awardees serve high-risk populations. Awardees tailor their programs to serve populations of need within their state.

- 72.3% of households were low income
- 27.6% of households included pregnant teens
- 7.1% of households included a child with developmental delays or disabilities

Michigan Performance Highlights

- **Increased Enrollment:** Implemented a Quality Improvement Learning Collaborative focused on outreach and enrollment, which resulted in an approximately 10% increase in enrollment in MIECHV-funded programs
- **Depression Screening:** 82.8% of caregivers enrolled in home visiting were screened for depression within 3 months of enrollment or within 3 months of delivery
- **Continuity of Insurance Coverage:** 80.3% of caregivers enrolled in home visiting had continuous health insurance coverage for at least 6 consecutive months
