

## HRSA's Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program

- Supports the [Tennessee Home Visiting Program](#) and provides voluntary, evidence-based home visiting programs for at-risk pregnant women and parents with young children up to kindergarten entry
- Builds upon decades of scientific research showing that home visits by a nurse, social worker, early childhood educator, or other trained professional during pregnancy and in the first years of a child's life helps prevent child abuse and neglect, supports positive parenting, improves maternal and child health, and promotes child development and school readiness

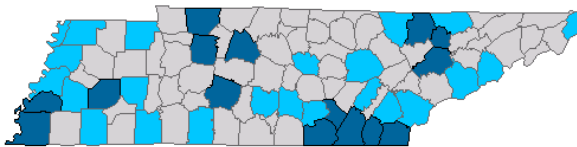

## Tennessee Serves a High-Risk Population

MIECHV Program awardees serve high-risk populations. Awardees tailor their programs to serve populations of need within their state.

- 7.7% of households included pregnant teens
- 48.3% of households were low income
- 10.5% of households reported a history of child abuse or maltreatment

## Tennessee Performance Highlights

- **Developmental Screening:** 77.8% of children enrolled in home visiting had a timely screen for developmental delays
- **Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) Screening:** 77.7% of caregivers enrolled in home visiting were screened for IPV within 6 months of enrollment
