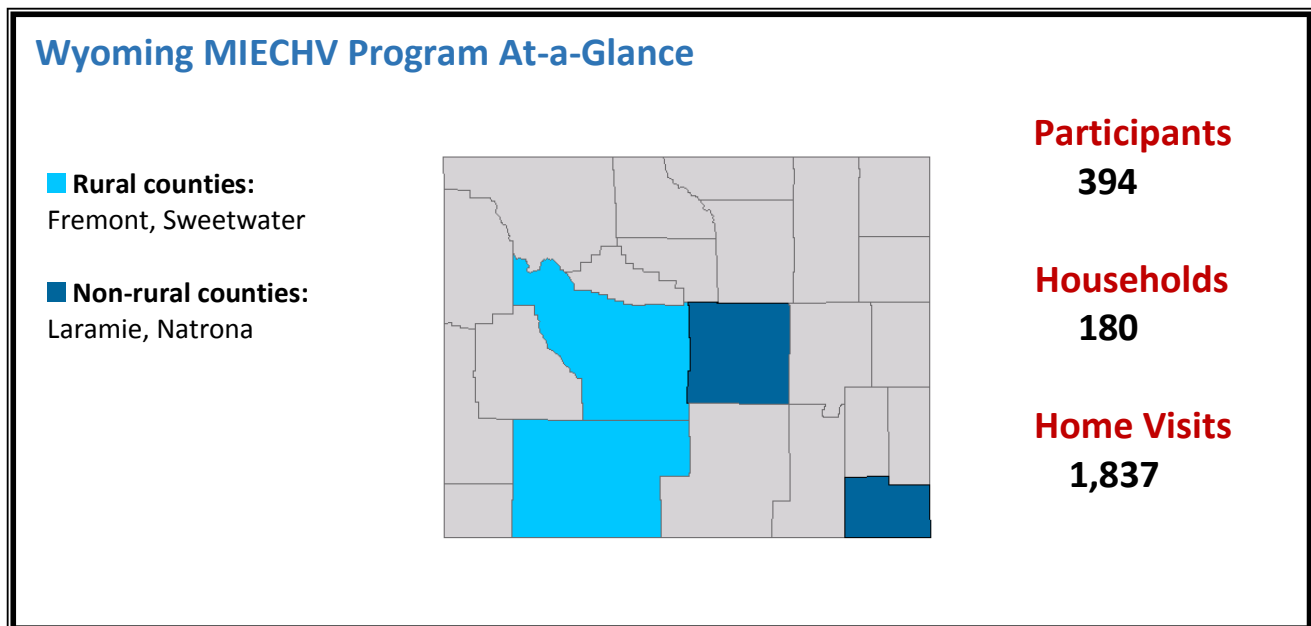


HRSA's Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program

- Supports the [Wyoming Home Visiting Program](#) and provides voluntary, evidence-based home visiting programs for at-risk pregnant women and parents with young children up to kindergarten entry
- Builds upon decades of scientific research showing that home visits by a nurse, social worker, early childhood educator, or other trained professional during pregnancy and in the first years of a child's life helps prevent child abuse and neglect, supports positive parenting, improves maternal and child health, and promotes child development and school readiness



Wyoming Serves a High-Risk Population

MIECHV Program awardees serve high-risk populations. Awardees tailor their programs to serve populations of need within their state.

- 50.0% of households were low income
- 22.2% of households included someone who used tobacco products in the home
- 20.6% of households included someone with low student achievement

Wyoming Performance Highlights

- **Enhanced Data Monitoring:** Collaborated with local implementing agencies (LIAs) to develop structure for monthly monitoring reports with performance measure data for each LIA. The reports empower supervisors and parent educators to use data to inform their work and guide continuous quality improvement
- **Behavioral Concerns:** Caregivers were asked if they had any concerns regarding their child's development, behavior, or learning in 96.3% of postpartum home visits
- **Early Language and Literacy Activities:** 95.1% of children enrolled in home visiting had a family member who read, told stories, and/or sang with them on a daily basis
