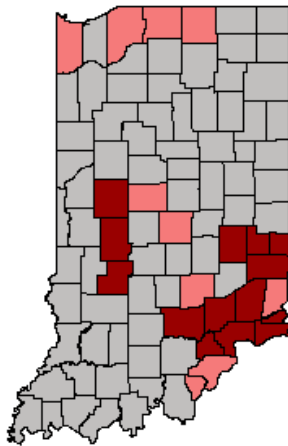


HRSA's Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program

Indiana Prioritizes Community Needs

MIECHV Program awardees tailor their programs to serve populations of need within their state. In Indiana:

- **92.4%** of households were at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and **71.4%** were at or below 100% of those guidelines.
- **10%** of households included a pregnant enrollee under age 21

Indiana Performance Highlights

MIECHV Program awardees track and report improvements in MIECHV benchmark areas every year. Awardees are required by authorizing statute to demonstrate improvement in benchmark areas every three years. In the most recent assessment following FY 2023, the Indiana MIECHV program successfully met the requirements for demonstration of improvement by improving in 5 of the 6 [benchmark areas](#).

FY 2023 Performance Highlights Include:

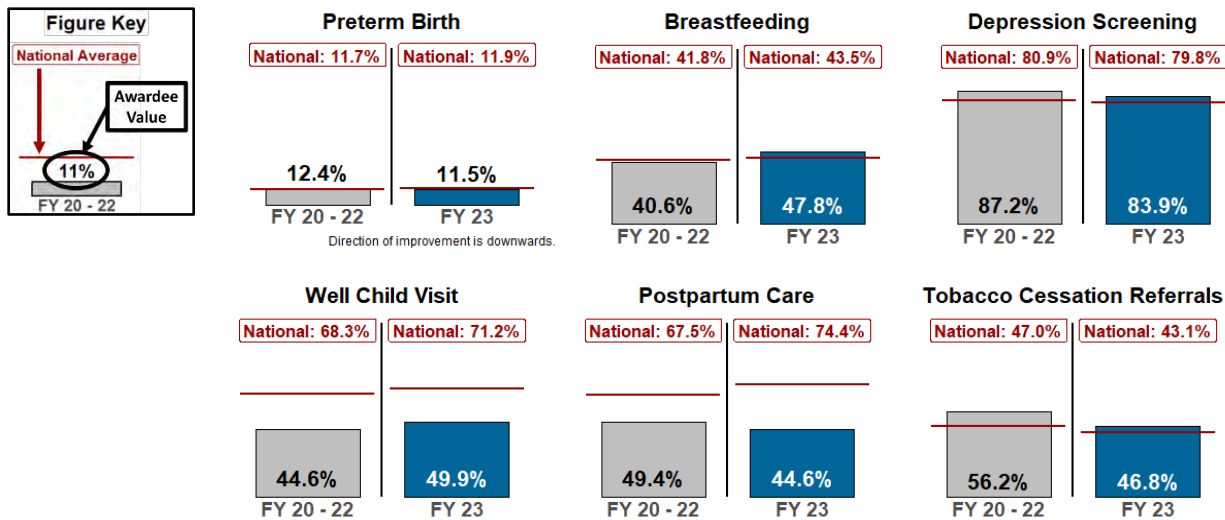
- **Disaggregated Data:** Indiana's MIECHV Program has analyzed select MIECHV performance measures disaggregated by key demographics. Based on this analysis, Indiana's MIECHV program has implemented discussion sessions with local implementing agencies to inform programming and begin to develop strategies for reducing disparities across performance measures.
- **Home Visiting Collaborative Planning:** Indiana state agencies supporting home visiting, including MIECHV, created a framework to guide the development of a comprehensive plan for the coordination of home visiting program services to ensure quality service delivery and sustainable growth.

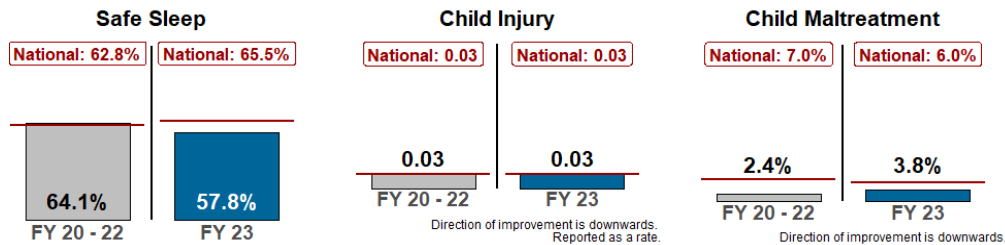

Indiana MIECHV Performance Data Compared to National MIECHV Averages

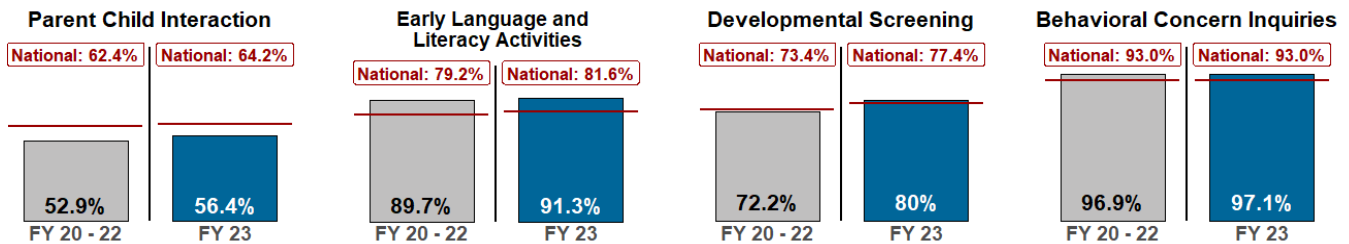
Benchmark Area 1: Maternal and Newborn Health Outcomes



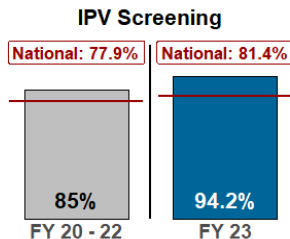
Benchmark Area 2: Child Injuries, Maltreatment, and Emergency Department Visits



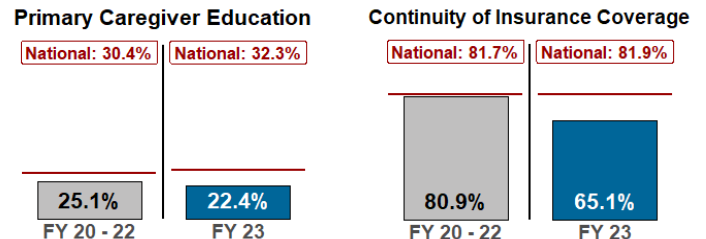
Benchmark Area 3: School Readiness and Achievement
