

Home Visiting Collaborative Improvement and Innovation Network (HV CollN) 2.0

<u>HV CollN 2.0</u> is a five-year cooperative agreement between HRSA and Education Development Center, Inc. which brings together Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) awardees and local implementing agencies (LIAs) to engage in collaborative learning, practice rapid testing for improvement, share best practices, scale tested interventions, and build QI capacity.

HV CoIIN 2.0 aims to build a movement and capability for ongoing learning that improves maternal and child health outcomes for families in home visiting by engaging 25 MIECHV awardees and 250 LIAs by 2022.

Building on the success of <u>HV CollN 1.0</u>, HV CollN 2.0 uses the Institute for Healthcare Improvement <u>Breakthrough Series</u> (BTS) and other proven quality improvement methods to accelerate improvements in select process and outcome measures for children and families within the

MIECHV Program across two workstreams:

- 1. **Scaling improvements** in previously tested topic areas such as maternal depression screening, treatment access and symptom reduction, and early detection and linkage to services for developmental risk.
- 2. Developing and subsequently scaling improvements in new topic areas such as intimate partner violence and well child visits.

Supports offered through HV CoIIN 2.0 include:

- Group and customized teaching and coaching from nationally renowned faculty experts in CQI practices, scale methods and content areas.
- Parent leadership coaches to help MIECHV awardees and local teams build and maintain strong leadership of families in system-level improvements.
- A suite of easy-to-use online resources including resources such as key driver diagrams, gold standard
 PDSA packages and measurement templates, to assist participants with getting started with CQI efforts, maintaining the gains and engaging in scale efforts.
- An easy-to-use, customizable data portal that provides on-demand data and supports virtual Plan, Do, Study, Act development and feedback loops.

HVCoEN2.0

The work of HV CoIIN 2.0 is spread across three cohorts through 2022. Currently, HV CoIIN 2.0 Cohort 1 is working with 11 MIECHV awardees and 73 LIAs across three topic areas. Eight months into cohort 1, teams are making great strides in achieving their aims by March 2020.

Scaling Maternal Depression

SMART Aim: By March 2020, 85% of women who screen positive for depression and access services will report a 25% reduction in symptoms in 12 weeks (from 1st service contact).

Scaling Developmental Promotion, Early Detection, and Early Intervention

SMART Aim: By March 2020, 80% of children with an identified developmental or behavioral concern will receive targeted developmental promotion and support in a timely manner, including an appropriate combination of home visitor-delivered developmental promotion, community services and/or Part C services.

New Topic: Intimate Partner Violence

SMART Aim: By March 2020:

- 90% of caregivers with identified intimate partner violence (IPV) are offered supports or services aligned with their self-identified needs and priorities.
- 85% of caregivers with identified IPV who are offered supports or services receive follow-up from home visitor.

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
